## Association health plans

Enables Arizona citizens to obtain quality and affordable health coverage by providing a new pathway for employer groups and associations to offer fully insured and self-insured Association Health Plans (APHs).



# Colorado River drought contingency amendments

An emergency measure that makes various changes to the management of water supplies, eligibility for and exchange of long-term storage credits, and groundwater fees collected in certain localities. Establishes new funds for groundwater and irrigation efficiency projects and for system conservation.


# SB 1271



## Purchaser dwelling actions; notice; complaints

Protects a homeowner's ability to be made whole by taking defects to court and being awarded appropriate damages and reasonable attorney fees for issues not warranted by the builder.

# HB 2371



## Real estate; licenses; applications

Requires an application for an original real estate, cemetery or membership camping license as a broker or salesperson to include any derivative of the applicant's first name, middle name or a nickname that is regularly used for advertising purposes.


# HB 2405



# Regulated water company; violations; enforcement

Allows the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) to make a request for corrective actions for a wastewater treatment facility or system or a public water system that is regulated by the Arizona Corporation Commission (ACC) under certain conditions.


# HB 2445



## TPT; residential rentals; notice

Requires a city or town that levies a TPT, sales, gross receipts, use, franchise or other similar tax or fee, applied to the business of renting or leasing real property for residential purposes, to send a notification by first-class mail to each residential TPT licensee and to the address of each residential rental property that there is a new or increased rate of tax at least 60 days before the effective date of the new or increased rate of tax.




## Occupational licensing; reciprocity

Requires an occupational or professional license or certificate to be issued, in the discipline applied for and at the same practice level as determined by the regulating entity, to a person who establishes residence in Arizona.

# SB 1021



## Department of revenue; electronic signatures

Expands the permitted of use of an "electronic signature" (defined elsewhere in statute) when signing and/or writing documents submitted to the Department of Revenue and has the same force and effect as a written signature.


# SB 1096



## Property management records; residential rentals

Adds flexibility to tenant document retention requirements that a property management firm must store for the specified time frame; additionally, adds flexibility to where the documents may be stored.


# HB 2686



## Building permits; utilities; restrictions; prohibition

Sets statewide preemption to prohibit a city, town or county from denying a building permit based on the project's utility provider or from imposing a fine or requirement that restricts an authorized utility provider's service or operation. Additionally, requires municipal and county regulations to preserve use of the services of an authorized utility provider and declares the regulation of building permits and the choice of utility providers a matter of statewide concern that is not subject to further regulation.


## SB 1211



# Administrative rules; expiration; legislative extension

Repeals all administrative rules on July 1, 2022, unless extended by an agency through the statutory rulemaking process. Repeals the Arizona Administrative Code (AAC) each year, beginning July 1, 2023, unless continued by the Legislature for up to one year.


# HB 2059



# Homeowners' associations; billing statements; waiver

Permits a unit owner's association and a homeowner's association to allow statements of account to be waived.

# HB 2351



## Real estate; employee; rent collection

Allows an unlicensed individual or independent contractor to collect rent and related fees in person for the use of real estate as part of the person's clerical duties if the person works for a Arizona licensee, collects the rent on the licensee's behalf and provides a receipt upon payment.

   Tax. Taxing people on Medical Doctors bills,
   Realtor services, or a mechanic's time places
   an undue burden on the consumer.
- 3. I feel that this should be handled like any other lawsuit and that the courts should decide this on a case by case basis. I don't think that builders or homeowners should have any extra built-in protections that make filing a suit disadvantageous to one side or the other.
- I'm generally in favor of reducing barriers to enter a given market, but real estate has such complicated rules and laws, I understand the need for licensing.
- 5. I generally feel that the government closest to the people is the best government. In short, I believe in local control as a general principle, but I'm open on a case by case basis.

The Arizona REALTORS® Residential Resale Real Estate Purchase Contract is the most commonly used form of contract for the transfer of resale residential property in Arizona. Therefore, it is vital for everyone involved in a residential transaction to know the contract terms. Your REALTOR® can provide you with a SAMPLE copy for thorough review, but here are a few highlights.

### • BUYER ATTACHMENT:

The Buyer Attachment cover page is not a part of the contract between the parties but alerts the buyer to some of the major provisions in the contract. It also informs the buyer of the risks associated with wire transfer fraud, a scheme used by cyber criminals to steal money via fake wiring instructions.

#### PROPERTY SECTION:

Both the buyer and the seller are identified and the agreement to buy and sell is spelled out. The Close of Escrow (COE) is defined as when the deed is recorded. The seller agrees to deliver possession and existing keys to the buyer at COE or as otherwise indicated. The fixtures and personal property to be included in the sale are also listed.

#### FINANCING SECTION:

If financing is involved, the buyer is obligated to take specific steps to obtain a loan and is required to attach a Pre-Qualification Form. If the buyer is unable in good faith to obtain loan approval by the specified time, the contract is cancelled, and the earnest money returned. The sale is also contingent upon an appraisal of the Premises for at least the purchase price.

#### TITLE AND ESCROW SECTION:

The contract is to be used as escrow instructions, and the escrow company is identified in this subsection. The escrow company is instructed to deliver to buyer and seller a commitment for title insurance together with copies of all documents that will remain as exceptions to the title insurance or title commitment.

#### DISCLOSURES SECTION:

The seller is obligated to deliver a completed Arizona REALTORS\* Seller's Property Disclosure Statement form to the buyer within three days after contract acceptance. The seller is also obligated to deliver a written five-year insurance claims history. If the premises were constructed prior to 1978, lead-based paint information must be provided.

## WARRANTIES SECTION:

Buyer and Seller agree the premises are being sold in its present physical condition. The Seller warrants that at COE all personal property not included in the sale and all debris will be removed; the premises will be in substantially the same condition as on the date of contract acceptance; and all agreed upon repairs/improvements will be completed. Warranties that survive closing are also identified in this section.

## • DUE DILIGENCE SECTION:

The buyer's inspection period is 10 days unless otherwise indicated. During the inspection period, the buyer can conduct all desired inspections and investigations. Prior to expiration of the inspection period, the buyer may deliver a signed notice of any items disapproved and cancel the contract or provide the seller the opportunity to correct the items. The buyer is advised to consult the Buyer Advisory provided by the

Arizona REALTORS® to assist with their due diligence inspections and investigations.

#### • REMEDIES SECTION:

If a party fails to comply with any provision of the contract, the other party must deliver a notice to the non-complying party specifying the non-compliance. If the non-compliance is not cured within three days after delivery of the notice, the failure to comply becomes a breach of contract.

## ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS SECTION:

A variety of additional terms are included in this section. For example, unless otherwise provided, delivery of all notices and documentation required or permitted in the contract must be in writing and hand-delivered; sent via facsimile; email; or sent by overnight courier.

#### SELLER ACCEPTANCE SECTION:

The seller acknowledges receipt of a copy of the contract and grants permission to the broker to deliver a copy to the buyer. If a counter offer is attached, the seller must sign and deliver both the offer set forth in the contract form and the counter offer. If there is a conflict between the offer and the counter offer, the provisions of the counter offer are controlling.
